- 3. We are, Luther notes, "at the same time saint and sinner." How are we a saint? In what way are we still a sinner?
- 4. Sainthood is a pure gift from God made possible only through Jesus' life, death, and resurrection. What difference has the gift of forgiveness and salvation in Christ made in your life?
- 5. "Keep alert," St. Paul writes, "making supplication for all the saints" (Ephesians 6:18). What specifically can you pray for God's Church—His saints—today?
