DEVOTION

What does this mean? God tempts no one. FOR SHARING

- 1. Temptation! The word brings to mind our human weakness and limitations. List common temptations in our world today.
- 2. Luther reminds us that the unholy trinity—the devil, the world, and our own sinful nature—often lead us into false belief, despair, and other great shame and vice. He also commented, "You can't keep the birds from flying overhead, but you can keep them from building a nest in your hair." Explain.
- 3. Paul writes that God will "provide the way of escape, that you may be able to endure" temptation (1 Corinthians 10:13). How has God strengthened you to endure temptation? What "escapes" has He provided?
- 4. Jesus faced temptation, was obedient to His heavenly Father, and defeated the devil (Matthew 4). Later, He showed His complete, perfect obedience in suffering and dying for our sins. In what ways can Jesus' sacrificial obedience help us when we are tempted?
- 5. In what ways can Christians help and support one another in times of temptation?
