## ΑCTIVITY

## **FAITH WALK**

**Theme:** Because our personal troubles often hinder us from trusting God as we should, the petitions of the Lord's Prayer remind us of our heavenly Father's trustworthy care.

Materials: Blindfolds

Procedure: (10 minutes)

Say, Today we will learn about the word we use to close the Lord's Prayer, "Amen." It comes from the Hebrew word for trust. Blindfold the students. Have all students line up, one behind the other, by putting their hands on the shoulders of the person in front of them. Lead the students on a "faith walk." Explain, When we say "Amen" at the end of a prayer, we are saying, "God, we trust You to guide us safely and keep us from all harm." The word "Amen" reminds us that God is trustworthy. He demonstrated His trustworthiness when He fulfilled His promise of salvation through Jesus.
