Lesson 10

Moses is Born Exodus 1:1-2:10

Choose from the following activities and crafts to help connect Bible learning to life.

☐ Baby Moses in a Bottle Craft Fill a clean plastic water bottle two-thirds full with water. Add a few drops blue food coloring. Cut a small piece of white craft foam into an oval and use a permanent marker to draw a small face. Put oval "baby" into bottle. It will float on the water. Securely tighten top to prevent leaking. Use a green permanent marker to draw green grass on the outside of the bottle or glue green construction paper strips to it.

☐ Helping Song Sing to the tune of "Are You Sleeping?": I'm a helper, I'm a helper. (Point to self.) Watch me now, watch me now. (Use index fingers and thumbs to make binoculars around eyes.) I can be a helper, I can be a helper. (Point to self.) This is how, this is how. Act out a helping action, such as picking up toys, making a bed, and the like, for the children to guess. Give children a turn to act out ways to help others too.

☐ Who Am I?

Give clues about who you are, and have children guess. Examples: I plant seeds to grow food. I ride a big tractor. Who am I? I made you breakfast. I brought you here today. Who am I? At last, say, God works through helpers to care for us. But we forgot one. This helper says, "I love you. I died on the cross for you. Who am I?" Yes, Jesus is our best helper because He paid for all our sins!

☐ Collect Baby Items

Lead students to make some posters to organize a collection of baby items to be donated to your local crisis pregnancy center or other local group that helps moms and their Please babies in need. Brainstorm items that Donate students could ask for and bring the following week. Make cards with Bible verses to put with the donations.
