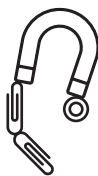
Moses and the Plagues Exodus 7

ACTIVITIES

Choose from the following activities and crafts to help connect Bible learning to life.

Magnet Power

Set out magnets and a tray with paper clips, washers, and other magnetic objects. Have children use the magnets to pick up the objects. Talk about the power of magnets. Ask one child to use a magnet to pick up an object and another child to use a magnet to draw that object off the first magnet. Use this experiment to talk about God's strength and how He has power to take away our troubles and fears.



Superheroes

Set out toy action figures. Talk about how superheroes in the movies use their power to rescue people from danger and bring them to safety. Say, **It is fun to play with action figures. But they are just pretend. But I know someone who can rescue people for real.**

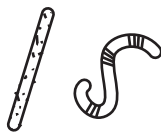
Do you? (God) God is real. He has all power.



Today, we talked about how God used His power to free His people from a bad king. God has power to help us too!

Staff and Snake Snack

Hand out pretzel rods and gummy worms. Say, **Before God sent the plagues, God gave a sign to show His power.** Show pretzel rod. **Aaron threw his staff to the ground and it became a snake.** Give children a gummy worm. **Then God sent the plagues to show His power.** Have children hold out their pretzel rods and review the plagues God sent to show He is God.



Turning Water Red

Set out a glass or clear plastic pitcher of water. Talk about the Nile River and how it was a source of life for the Egyptians. Then tap a wooden spoon on the edge (like a staff) and pour in red drink mix to change it. (Remind kids that God didn't need drink mix and that people couldn't drink the water when God was done.)
