Lesson 11

Abomination Nation Ezekiel 8; 10:1–19; 36:22–28

ACTIVITIES

Choose from the following activities and crafts to help connect Bible learning to life.

Dirty Hands/Clean Hands
Bring in a container of dirt or mud.
Talk about how God set His people apart to be clean, but because of our sin, we get dirty. Let children dig in the dirt. God's people in exile got dirty by worshiping other idols in the temple. Have children wash hands and talk about how God sets us apart and makes us clean and holy in the waters of Baptism.

God's Name
God promised to restore His people
so that all people would know His
name. See how many names of God
students can think of (I Am, Yahweh,
Good Shepherd, etc.) Look for a place in the
Bible where those names are used. Have students draw a "word cloud" with all the names of
God.

Special Snack
Serve sugar cookies with sprinkles
or frosting. Talk with children about
how cookies are a special treat. God
is the most special being in the world.
He is holy and without sin. He is also loving and
forgiving. He forgives our sins through Jesus
and changes our hearts so we can love Him too.

Opposites Game
Review the story by playing a
game of opposites with the children. Demonstrate an action
and have children do the opposite action (ideas include push/pull, stand up/sit down, loud/quiet, stay/go, over/under). Talk with children about how God's people did the opposite of what He had told them to do. Instead of worshiping God, they worshiped false gods in the temple-church. We deserve to be punished for our sins, but God did the opposite by sending
Jesus to save us!
