Unwilling Prophet Jonah 1–3

ACTIVITIES

Choose from the following activities and crafts to help connect Bible learning to life.

□ Jonah and Jesus Jonah wanted to exclude the Ninevites from God's gift of forgiveness. Jesus did the exact opposite. Challenge older children to find times in the Bible when Jesus shared His love with people whom others tried to exclude. Have children use their Bibles to look up passages like Matthew 9:9-13; Matthew 19:13-15; and Luke 19:1-10.	Serve stick pretzels and fish crackers. Talk about what they think Jonah might have done in the fish (Jonah 2 shows Jonah prayed, "I'm sorry, God.") and how God used the fish to save Jonah. Make pretzel crosses. Say, God saves us through Jesus.

Paper Bag Fish Craft
On the bottom of a paper lunch
bag, draw a smile. Draw eyes or
glue on wiggle eyes. Color all sides
of the bag. Decorate with sequins
or stickers. Stuff the fish with newspaper. Use
yarn to tie the bag shut between the body and
tail (bag opening). Say, God saved and forgave
Jonah and the people of Nineveh. God saves
and forgives us too, for Jesus' sake.
