Jesus Is Alive! Action Song

Sing the following to the tune of “The Farmer in the Dell.” Do the actions in the song.

Clap your hands* and celebrate:

Jesus is alive.

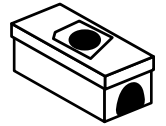
*Add other stanzas such as “Stomp your feet,” “Wave your arms,” “Jump in place,” and “Shout ‘hooray.’”

Easter Peek Box Craft

Cut a 3-inch circle in a shoebox lid. Glue yellow tissue paper to cover the opening. Cut a hole in the short end of the box to represent the tomb opening. Paint the lid green and the box gray, or glue on colored paper. Talk about how Isaiah said the Savior would be buried in a rich person’s tomb. Say, **Pretend this is Jesus’ tomb. What do you see when you look inside?**

(Nothing) **Where is Jesus?**

(He is alive! On Easter, Jesus rose from the dead. He forgives our sins and gives us a home in heaven.)



Cookie Snack

Let children frost cross-shaped or round sugar cookies. Invite children to tell the Easter story.



Jesus died on the cross to pay for our sins. But on Easter, Jesus rose again from the tomb.
