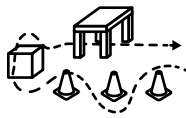

## ACTIVITIES

Choose from the following activities and crafts to help connect Bible learning to life.

### Obstacle Course

Say, **Josiah was just eight years old when he became king. Do you think he liked to run and hop and jump like you do?** Set up an obstacle course and assign tasks to do (e.g., hop around the cone or box, jump over the carpet squares, run in place, crawl under the table, wiggle through a Hula Hoop).



### Bible Verse Fun

Sing to the tune of “The Farmer in the Dell”:

**The Bible is God’s Word.**

**The Bible is God’s Word.**

**It tells us that God loves us so.**

**The Bible is God’s Word.**

Then, say, **God tells us in the Bible:** (read **Jeremiah 10:1**; then, say the verse together)

**Hear the Word** *Open hands like a book.*

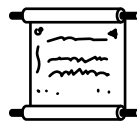
**that the LORD** *Point up.*

**speaks to you.** *Cup hands around mouth.*



### Scroll Craft

Say, **Today, we heard how Josiah and his helpers found God’s Word in the temple-church.** Show a picture of a scroll. **Long ago, the Bible was written on big scrolls like this. Today, we’ll make a Bible scroll.** Cut the bottom off brown paper lunch bags, then cut along the side and lay the bags flat. Have the children write the Bible Verse on their bag and decorate it with stickers and markers. Tape straws to each short end of the scroll. Roll up from each side and tie with ribbon.



### Hide and Seek Bibles

Before starting, hide three to five Bibles. Tell children you are going to play hide and seek but are looking for hidden Bibles.

Say, **When you find a Bible, hold it up and say, “Hear the Word that the LORD speaks to you.”** Afterward, ask, **Why is God’s Word so important to us? Where can we hear it?**
