

# Lesson 13

A Mountaintop Wonder  
Luke 9:28–36

## ACTIVITIES

Choose from the following activities and crafts to help connect Bible learning to life.

### Transfiguration Craft

Find a picture of Jesus with outstretched arms. Trace the shape on white or glittered-white paper.



Cut out the silhouette. On a piece of blue background paper, use orange and yellow crayons to draw rays coming out from the center of the page. Then glue the white Jesus silhouette in the middle. Children can label the page “Jesus’ Transfiguration.”

### Mountaintop Moments

Very often, God uses mountains as places to talk to His servants directly. If you have older children who are good at research, have them make a list of all the times that God speaks directly to individuals on mountains in both the Old and the New Testaments. Children can also make small illustrations next to their lists. Hint: use a digital device and a Bible app to search for “mountain.”



### Glitter Cross

Have children wrap tissue-paper squares around the eraser end of a pencil, dip in glue, and stick in a cross shape to a paper plate.



Around the rim, print the Bible Verse. Use glitter glue to decorate the plate. Use yarn to make a hanger for it. Say, **The shiny glitter reminds us that at Jesus’ transfiguration, He showed His glory as God’s Son.**

### Sing!

Sing “The King of Glory” (look online for music).
