Lesson 5

The Pointing Prophet Matthew 3; John 1:29–34

ACTIVITIES

Choose from the following activities and crafts to help connect Bible learning to life.

"Point the Way" Craft
Give each child a 4 x 6-inch note
card, an unsharpened pencil, and
markers. Show how to cut a V-shape
in the short side of the note card
to make it look like a banner. Tape
a pencil to the opposite side. Draw a cross or
lamb design on the flag. Children may sharpen
the pencil if they wish and use the flag as a
reminder that John pointed to Jesus as the
Lamb of God who takes away sin. What can they
tell about Jesus?

Washing Water Play
Set out play plastic dishes and a dishpan of water on a bath towel. Add some soap to make it sudsy. Talk about how water washes away dirt and makes things clean. Say, God sent John to help people get ready for Jesus. John told them to repent. That means be sorry for your sins. Then he baptized them.

Lamb of God Hymn
Sing together "Lamb of God"
(Lutheran Service Book 550). This is
a simple hymn to teach and sing or
even play on the piano. Older students may
enjoy looking in the index of first lines for other
hymns that talk about the Lamb of God (LSB
434, 962, and 963). Read the hymn stanzas and
talk about the meaning and rich language there.

Use masking tape to make two lines on the floor, about a foot apart, for the banks of the Jordan River. The space between is "water." Children take turns jumping across the river. Gradually increase the distance between the lines. See how far the children can jump before they "get their feet wet" in the river. Say, John told about Jesus on the banks of the Jordan River. He told people to get ready for Jesus by being sorry for their sins, and then he baptized people.
