## Lesson 13

The Living Wonder Mark 15:16–16:8

## **ACTIVITIES**

Choose from the following activities and crafts to help connect Bible learning to life.

Use jelly beans to teach God's plan of salvation: Purple reminds us of our sin. Red reminds us that Jesus shed His blood to pay for our sins. White reminds us that Jesus rose. Blue reminds us that Jesus gives us a home in heaven.

Easter Egg Fun
Set a tub of rice on a
towel with plastic Easter
eggs and scoops. Show children how to open
the eggs and scoop and pour the rice. Talk about
how the eggs and scoops are full and empty.
Say, On Good Friday, Jesus died and was put
in a tomb. On Easter, His tomb was empty!

Option: Hide "surprises" in the rice for children
to find. Talk about God's Easter surprise.

Beanbag Balance
Provide a beanbag for children. Talk
about how Jesus carried the cross on
His back. Have them carry the beanbags
on their back. Say, It was tricky to carry our
beanbags. But it was harder for Jesus to carry
the cross. Then, hardest of all, He died on
the cross to pay for our sins! But Jesus didn't
stay dead. What happened on Easter? Yes,
He came alive. Toss the beanbags in the air and
shout, "Alleluia!"

Active Review
Say, When Jesus died, the sky got dark
and the ground shook. Have children
pretend to be the ground shaking and rumbling.
(Stamp feet and pat legs.) Say, Jesus' friends put
Him in a tomb and rolled a stone in front of
it. Have children pretend to be the stone by rolling on the ground. It was there one, two, three
days. On Easter morning, the earth began to
shake again. (Rumble and shake.) God sent an
angel to roll the stone away. Have children roll
back to their original spot. Surprise! Jesus is
alive!
