## ACTIVITIES

Choose from the following activities and crafts to help connect Bible learning to life.

### Look, It's You!

Have children use magnifying glasses to look at their fingers and your fingers. Say, **No one has fingerprints like yours!** Have children look at themselves in a mirror. Say, **Look. It's [Aubrey]. I can tell it's you because I can see your [brown hair and freckles]! Today we'll hear how Thomas had to see and touch Jesus to be sure He was really alive.**



### I Doubt It Game

Do some research before beginning and make a list of what seem like unbelievable things that happen in the Bible, ending with Jesus rising from the dead. Then throw in some things that didn't actually happen in the Bible. Mix up your list and play a game where children respond with the words "I doubt it" or "I believe."



### Peace Poem

When Jesus appeared to the disciples and to Thomas, He immediately said, "Peace." Jesus brings peace, and He has made peace between God and man. Together, write the letters in the word *PEACE* vertically on a page and use each letter to start a line of a poem about how Jesus brings us peace. Illustrate the poem.



### O-Shaped Snack

Serve O-shaped pretzels or cereal. Talk about how Os can remind us of open mouths. Say, **Thomas used his mouth to say, "My Lord and my God" when he touched Jesus and saw He was alive. You can use your mouth to say, "Jesus is my Lord and God" too.**
