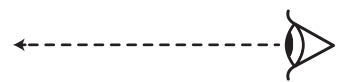
Choose from the following activities and crafts to help connect Bible learning to life.

Braille



Look online for more information about braille. Show an example of the braille alphabet and have children draw their names in the dot configuration of braille. Do some online research about ways that we share the Good News of Jesus with those who are visually impaired. Identify ways that you can help those ministries.

I Spy



Play several rounds of the game I Spy. Start by giving clues to help children identify something in the room. Then give clues to help children guess the name of someone in the Bible, someone they cannot see. Take turns giving the clues.

Amazing Grace



Look at the lyrics of “Amazing Grace” (LSB 744), especially the line “was blind but now I see!” Research the life of hymnwriter John Newton and what he means by being blind and now seeing. Talk about why people love this hymn so much and about God’s grace for us in Jesus. Play one of the many recordings available online.

Jesus Heals Me Collage



Set out colorful bandages, cotton balls, tongue depressors (craft sticks), pictures of medicine, and the like. Use glue sticks or tape to add the items to construction paper to make a collage. Use craft sticks to make a cross. Talk about ways Jesus heals us (in answer to prayer, through medicine and doctors, and so on). He heals our hearts by taking away our sins and making us His children.
