Choose from the following activities and crafts to help connect Bible learning to life.

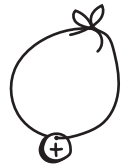
Picture Sequencing

Give children magazines to cut out pictures of a baby, toddler, young child, teenager, parent, and grandparent. Have the children arrange the figures into various groups (boys and girls, in order from tallest to shortest, etc.). Then ask them to arrange them from youngest to oldest. Say, **God the Holy Spirit helps us learn about Jesus from God's Word. He helps us grow bigger; He helps our faith grow too.**



Faith Necklace

Note: Make necklace pendant this week, decorate it next week. Shape a small piece of white, air-dry clay into a $\frac{1}{4}$ -inch-thick, flat circle. Use a pencil to etch a heart and cross or other symbol into the clay. Poke a small hole at the top of the circle. Let the clay dry. Next week, let children decorate the clay with markers. Then thread a 24-inch cord through the hole in the circle and tie to make a necklace.



Nutritious Snack

Serve nutritious foods such as carrot sticks and apple slices. Talk about how our bodies need nutrients every day in order to grow and stay healthy. God helps us grow stronger in faith when we hear His Word.



Epistles in the Bible

Explain that the word *epistle* means “a letter with Christian doctrine and instruction.” Give children a Bible. Have them turn to the New Testament and find the 22 epistles contained there. Assign children to research and then share information about (author, recipients, and such).
